As Regards State wise performance of MSME registration Maharastra consists of 16 percent of total registered MSME (1059956) as on 31st March 2019, followed by Bihar (12.4%), Tamil Nadu (11.7%), Uttar Pradesh (10.5%), Madhya Pradesh (9.6%), Gujarat (9.4%), Rajasthan (5.9%), Andhra Pradesh (4%), Telangana (3.3%), Karnataka (3.1%), West Bengal (2.5%), Punjab and Jharkhand (1.8%), Hariyana (1.7%), Delhi (1.5%), Kerala and Odisha (1.3%), Chattisgarh (0.5%), Manipur (0.4%), Uttarkhand (0.3%) Assam, Goa, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu & Kashmir, Tripura, A&N Islands, Chandigarh, and Puducherry (0.1%), Arunachal Pradesh, Meghalaya, Mizoram, Nagaland, Sikkim, Daman & Diu, and lakshdeewp.




Chart 3.1Registered MSMEs in India as on 31st March 2019


